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Highlights

- 1. The total No. of Government employees in the state as on 31st March 2013 is 93,530 which accounts to 4.73% of the total population (19,78,502) of Nagaland and it also accounts to 9.60% of the total workers (9,74, 122) in the state as per 2011 Census.
- 2. There is an increase of 2159 employees in the state during 2012-13.
- 3. Police (26,135) has the highest No. of employees among the departments in the state followed by School Education (15,750) and Health and Family Welfare (6,723).
- 4. Higher Education (491) has the highest No. of Class –I (Gazette Officer) among the department in the state followed by Health and Family Welfare (417) and Police (308).
- 5. School Education (338) has the highest No. of Class II (Gazette Officer) among the department in the state followed by Police (260) and PWD (Road & Bridges) (215).
- 6. Police (23336) has the highest No. of Class –III employees among the departments in the state followed by School Education (13084) and Health and Family Welfare (3461).
- 7. Health and Family Welfare (2792) has the highest No. of Class IV employees among the departments in the state followed by Public Health Engineering (2602) and Police(2231).
- 8. Out of the total number of employees, 4.16% of the total employees are class I, Class II with 2.81%, Class III with 67.57% and Class –IV with 25.46% of the total employees.
- 9. Female employees comprises of 22.03% of the total employees and male employees are found to be at 77.97%.
- 10. Christian employees dominated the employment in state government with 93.42% while Hindu, Muslim and Others are found to be 5.64%, 0.08% and 0.86% respectively
- 11. Out of the total No. of employees in the state, 93.24% of the employees are Schedule Tribes while remaining 6.76% of the total employees are from General, SC and OBC category.
- 12. The state government employees are found to be mostly young as 56.28% of the employees are in the age group between 26 45 years, 7.59 % of the total employees are in the age group between 18-25 years, and 22.46% of the total employees are in the age group between 46-60 years. About 13.67% of the total employees did not disclose their date of birth.
- 13. The percentage of Post Graduate, Graduate, PU/10+2, Matriculate, Under matric, and Illiterate among the employees are 3.14%, 12.24%, 11.41%, 18.98%, 52.20% and 2.03% respectively.
- 14. The ratio between Plan and Non Plan post is found to be 8.92.

INTRODUCTION

The Directorate of Economics & Statistics has been conducting the "Census of the State Government Employees" since 1964, with 31st March as its reference date. The present report is forty - second in the series covering all the State Government employment including permanent, temporary, contract, deputation, work charged, and ad hoc as on 31st March 2013. This report gives detail features on the magnitude of employment in the state government along with analysis in regard to their status, nature of employment, pay, religion, social status, etc.

OBJECTIVE

The report on the Census of the Government Employees of Nagaland is prepared with a view to present the following information.

- 1. The total No. of Government Employees in the state and also its increase/decrease over a period of years.
- 2. The total No. of Government Employees according to their nature of appointment Permanent, Temporary, Contract, Deputation, Ad hoc and work charge post.
- 3. The total No. of Government Employees according to Gender, Social Status and Religion.
- 4. The status of Educational Qualification of the Government Employees.
- 5. The categorization of the Basic Pay and Total Emolument of the Government Employees.
- 6. Age wise, No. of Government Employees in the state.
- 7. The status of Plan and Non Plan post in the state.
- 8. Department wise, total No. of Government Employees in the State.
- 9. District wise, total No. of Government Employees in the State.

SCOPE AND COVERAGE

The publication covers all the Government Employees in the state as on 31st March 2013.

METHODOLOGY

A prescribed proforma was circulated to all the heads of department in the state for collecting the requisite information of the employees working under their control.

LIMITATIONS

This report is based on the information provided by the concerned Department. This report does not cover employees working under Public Sector Undertaking of the state government.

FINDINGS OF THE CENSUS

Figure-1 Graphical presentation of the decadal growth trend of employment in State Government













Regular employees are classified into permanent and temporary. Permanent employees are those groups of employees whose post are confirmed while temporary employees are those groups of employees whose post are not confirmed.

From the figures presented above, it is found that the percentage of regular post is the highest in Class - I (96.04%) while the percentage of regular post tends to decrease with the decrease in the status of employees i.e. Class - II (93.87%), Class - III (91.18%) and Class - IV (70.33%)

The percentage of Ad hoc and work charge employees in the state are highest in Class – IV category of employees with about 27.22% of the Class – IV employees. The trends tends to decrease in higher level post i.e. Class – III (6.3%), Class – II (2.59%) and class – I.1 (1%)

Contract and deputation nature of employment are highest in Class – II category with 3.54 % followed by 2.85 % each in Class – I, 2.52 in Class – III and 2.44 % in Class -IV category.



Graphical presentation of the trend of female employees




With the increase in the number of employees in the state government, the numbers of female employees have also increased by 1026 during 2012- 2013.

No. of employees according to religion





Graphical presentation of employees according to their ages


